Enchanted Lake Elementary School is located in Kailua, a suburb of Honolulu on the Windward side of the island of Oahu. The school was established in 1963.

Academics begin with the mission that student learning is the school's chief priority. Academic achievement and improvement are imperative to enable students to become confident and self-directed lifelong learners. At Enchanted Lake, students demonstrate their understanding of essential knowledge and skills, and are actively involved in solving problems and producing quality work. Teachers value students as individuals with unique physical, social, emotional and intellectual needs. Everyone at Enchanted Lake is committed to student success.

School partnerships include the School Community Council (SCC) with parents, community, students, support staff, teachers and administrators as key stakeholders. The SCC provides input into the school's academic, financial and strategic plan as well as the principal's annual evaluation. An active Parent Teacher Association serves as the fundraising arm of the school through the support services of the Parent Community Networking Coordinator, with an array of programs from the Kolea Club activities, including family nights, annual Jog-a-thon, catalog sales, and the volunteer commitment of room parents, technical assistants, and reading and math tutors.

Heeia Elementary School

Heeia Elementary School opened in 1960, set against the magnificent Koolau Mountains and located on the fringe of Kaneohe's growing business community. The student population is predominantly part-Hawaiian, Caucasian and Japanese. Students come from low to upper-middle income homes.

There is a strong sense of family and community at Heeia Elementary School. Located on the Windward side of Oahu, where most of its staff members live, Heeia is a place where children and grandchildren of former students attend, and where alumni have returned to work. The school facilities are heavily used by youth sports and community organizations. Additionally, Heeia receives strong support from an active Parent Teacher Association and School Community Council. Parent leaders are involved in Castle Complex parent leadership groups and take an active role in planning evening activities and events on campus, special field trips and overnight activities.

Heeia Elementary School has a strong focus on academic achievement and employs a variety of strategies to ensure success. Teachers meet to collect data about the students and the data is then analyzed with the grade level. Progress and planning for student achievement is done. Grade representatives meet in Math, Science and Literacy committees to generate a school-wide, standards-based curriculum. These committees drive the school's curriculum, to ensure students' academic needs are met. Students who are not proficient in Math and Language Arts receive help from dedicated support teams made up of staff members who assist both teachers and students. The support can range from analyzing data for teachers, to providing the students with mini-lessons to improve basic skills.

Hokulani Elementary School

Nestled between the University of Hawaii at Manoa and the lower Kaimuki business district, Hokulani Elementary School serves approximately 360 students from preschool/kindergarten through fifth grade and is noted for its students' high test performance. The school serves the communities of St. Louis, Kaimuki and Moiliili. Hokulani provides a caring and challenging environment, where students receive a foundation for continuous positive growth.

Built in 1958, Hokulani School attracts approximately 68 percent of its student population from neighborhoods outside of its school boundary. Of the student population, 6 percent are identified Special Education, 10 percent have limited English proficiency and 16 percent receive free or reduced-price meals.

In 2005, Hokulani School was recognized as a No Child Left Behind Blue Ribbon School. Believing all children can learn, the staff continually strives to improve the instructional strategies and curriculum to challenge every student. Teachers implement an exemplary standards-based educational program across content areas and are committed to providing all students with innovative, data-driven and student-centered learning opportunities.

Hokulani is a peace-centered school and implements the group process called Tribes that promotes cooperative learning, social skills and responsibility. Since 1993, students have participated yearly in a cultural exchange program with their peers from Japan.
